MEMORANDUM FOR LEADERS, SENIOR MILITARY COLLEGES

SUBJECT: SMC Ethics Bowl

1. Background:

WHAT

The Senior Military College's Intercollegiate Ethics Bowl (SMCIEB) Competition (hosted by UNG) is a one-day, virtual collegiate competition held amongst the six SMCs within the United States in partnership with the TRUIST Center for Ethical Leadership (TRUIST CEL). Teams from each of the six SMCs would compete in a debate-style competition around six ethical cases developed in partnership with each of the six SMCs and the TRUIST CEL. The six ethical case topics would be determined by the SMCs and written/finalized by the TRUIST CEL. There would be two rounds and a final round within the competition to determine the top team. The inaugural year was 2023. UNG was unable to host the competition in 2024 and we now propose to restart the SMCIEB in spring 2025. The top team will be awarded the 1st place SMCIEB trophy and a \$5,000 operational donation from the TRUIST CEL, awarded to their SMC-Commandant's/Superintendent's Office.

WHY

The SMCs are leadership development institutions. This event provides an opportunity for our future military leaders (and potentially our current military leaders who may serve as judges) to discuss (proactively) top ethical issues facing the United States military.

2. <u>Timeline 2024/2025</u>:

FALL 24 SMC Teams recruited/determined for Spring 25 (3-6 Cadets)

DEC (by 13th) TRUIST CEL releases the competition cases

DEC SMC Teams planning/researching/practicing/preparing



3. <u>Requirements</u>: Each SMC will develop one competition team comprised of a min. of three and max. of six Cadets (with a Coach) that will compete on behalf of the SMC during the competition. Each SMC will recruit at least one judge for the competition, in collaboration with the TRUIST CEL. Optional: Each SMC can provide a case topic for consideration.

<u>Note – Additional UNG Requirements</u>: There will be three moderators, which will be UNG Cadets, they will moderate both the main rounds and one will go on to moderate the final round.
