



Costs of Attendance

- A student's total cost of attendance (COA) is the sum of all expenses a student will incur during the academic year. This includes tuition, fees, housing, meals, travel, and insurance.
- A student's COA is determined by their residency status and the type of housing they choose to live in. The University of North Georgia provides a COA estimate for each student based on these factors.
- The University of North Georgia provides a COA estimate for each student based on these factors. The COA estimate is used to determine the amount of financial aid a student is eligible to receive.

Financial Aid

- A student's financial aid package is determined by their financial need, which is calculated by subtracting the COA from the student's expected family contribution (EFC).
- The University of North Georgia provides a variety of financial aid options, including grants, scholarships, and student loans. The amount of financial aid a student is eligible to receive is based on their financial need and the amount of aid available.
