

Quick Overview of Supplemental Instruction (SI) University of North Georgia

What is SI?

SI is an internationally recognized academic assistance program that targets historically difficult courses (30% or higher DWF rates). Students are hired as SI facilitators and trained to lead study review sessions and incorporate collaborative learning techniques as a compliment to the course material taught in the classroom. The SI facilitator for each course sits in the course lecture (that they have successfully completed in a prior semester) and facilitates two, ~~one~~ hour study sessions each week for ~~the~~ students enrolled in the course. In addition, the SI facilitator assists the instructor by reviewing information that the professor deems necessary to benefit students in the course.

What is the Benefit to Student Participants?

Students who attend SI ~~sess~~ions develop the necessary study skills to better prepare them for current and future coursework. At the University of North Georgia, SI student participants earn, on average, half a letter grade higher than those who do not attend SI sessions.
